Active International Students Quick Facts *March 2021 Update*






Background:

NAFSA, APLU and INTO previously released, <u>Factors Influencing U.S. International Student Enrollment Growth</u>, a groundbreaking report highlighting the findings of a longitudinal analysis of data derived from 11 publicly available sources. In December 2020, the Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP) published <u>raw snapshot data</u> reflecting active Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS) records in September 2020, which provide new insights into the impact of the global pandemic on international students.


SEVP data show there were a total of 905,277 active international student records in September 2020. Data covering August 2018 to January 2020 demonstrate an average decline of 1.7 percent. Between January 2020 and September 2020, the decline surged to 21 percent. The difference between the three-year average and the 2020 figure represents an excess decline of 19.3 percent over and above what would have been expected, all things being equal.

Change in Active International Students by Top Sending Country



Change in Active International Students by Continent




Change in Active International Students by Level of Study
